

# Frequently Asked Questions about College Financial Aid for Latino Families: FAFSA and SCHOLARSHIPS

#### Federal Aid for Students

The United States federal government through its Department of Education offers opportunities to receive help to pay for higher education. There are various types of help available, including, grants, loans, and work study. #### What is FAFSA?

FAFSA is the Free Application for Federal Student Aid. It is an application that determines the financial need of a family. It is free, easy, and available in Spanish.

Can students fill out the form if they or their parents do not have papers? Yes, undocumented students and students who are citizens with undocumented parents can still complete FAFSA. But only students that are citizens, permanent residents, or within certain eligible immigrant categories can receive federal student aid. These categories do not include recipients of Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA).

Why should a student or family without papers complete FAFSA? For undocumented students, including those with DACA, it is important that they receive a report to show the family's need for financial support. Private scholarships or universities can accept it in order to determine if they can provide financial help.

How can I complete it? You can complete it online in Spanish at by creating an account at <a href="https://fafsa.ed.gov/es\_ES/">https://fafsa.ed.gov/es\_ES/</a>. You can also print it in Spanish at <a href="https://fafsa.ed.gov/es\_ES/options.htm">https://fafsa.ed.gov/es\_ES/options.htm</a>.

If a student has a social security number (SSN): You can create an account online using your SSN. If your parents do not have a SSN they can put all zeros in place of it and then print it, sign it, and mail it.

If a student does not have a social security number: You can fill out the form by hand and do not need to fill in the space with the social security number.

Who can help me fill it out? An academic counselor at a high school may be able to help

### **Paying for College**

Financial aid is money that can help you pay for college.

Most full-time college students receive some kind of financial aid.

#### There are four major types of financial aid:

#### 1. Grants

Grants are "gift aid" because they do not have to be paid back. Grants come from federal and state governments and from colleges. Most grants are need based which means they are usually given based on your or your family's financial circumstances.

#### 2. Scholarships

Scholarships also do not need to be paid back. Scholarships come from governments, colleges, and private organizațions. They may be awarded for academic or athletic ability, interest in a certain subject, or volunteer work. Some scholarships are given based on membership in an ethnic or religious group. Employers may also give scholarships to children of employees.

#### 3. Loans

Borrowing money from a bank, government, or lending company is called taking out a loan. A loan must be paid back with an extra charge called interest. The federal government offers low-interest loans to students with financial need. Other lenders charge more interest.

#### 4. Work-Study Programs

Federal Work-Study is a kind of financial aid and part of the financial aid package. When you fill out your FAFSA, you could earn a work-study award. Your college will guarantee you a paid, part-time job. The money will help you cover your college expenses. Work-study jobs can be found on- and off-campus.

## How to Apply for Financial Aid: FILE YOUR FAFSA

Completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.gov is required for any student seeking federal and state financial aid, including grants and loans at all colleges. Most Birmingham students are eligible for a Pell Grant of up to \$5,775 to pay for college.
