

Separation Agreement – Pelham City Schools – 2014-15 School year and Thereafter

It is the position of the Shelby County Board of Education (“the Board”) that children of parent(s) or guardian(s) whose principal residence is located within the various subdivisions listed below on or before **May 21, 2015**, will be allowed to attend the respective Shelby County school for which those children were zoned to attend prior to the separation of the Pelham City Board of Education on July 1, 2014; provided, however, that the said parent or guardian continues to maintain and reside in such principal residence (or in another residence located within the listed subdivisions) and that such school attendance is continuous and uninterrupted. This shall also apply to:

1. siblings of such children (whether such siblings are born or unborn at this time); and
2. any child, born after this date, if the principal residence of the parent(s) or guardian(s) of such child was located within any of the said subdivisions on or before May 21, 2015, and the said parent or guardian continues to maintain and reside in such residence (or in another residence located within the listed subdivisions).

The said subdivisions and schools to which they relate are as follow:

Bent Creek, Courtyard Manor, Deer Ridge, Oaklyn Hills, Windstone

Forest Oaks Elementary, Chelsea Middle and Chelsea High

Summer Place

Oak Mountain Elementary/Intermediate/Middle/High

Residents will be required to complete an application to Shelby County Schools during the spring of 2015 to identify current or known future students, along with the verification of their address. On, May 21, 2015, a list will be established identifying current residents in the above listed subdivisions for the purpose of creating a database of students (or future students) that could be eligible for enrollment in Shelby County Schools.

The Board reserves the right to modify, revise and change this position in any way and at any time and without notice. This position statement is not intended to create any individual right for any child to attend the particular Shelby County schools described herein.
